## Assessment and Reporting at Whitchurch High School in Curriculum for Wales

## Approach to Learning

A learner's 'Approach to Learning' will be referred to as their 'Learning Behaviours'. These are the key behaviours that we consider to be necessary to enable individual learners to make progress in Whitchurch. They focus on the whole learner; their cognitive, emotional and social behaviours in school. We will report whether learners display the individual learning behaviours 'Always', 'Mostly', 'Sometimes' or 'Rarely' and help them to understand how they can 'Always' display the required behaviour by providing examples in their report. The <u>four</u> 'Learning Behaviours'; a description of each and some examples of what the behaviour looks like is shown in the table below:

## **Progress**

The purpose of assessment is to support our learners to make progress. Assessment is integral to learning and teaching and takes place regularly in all lessons here at Whitchurch. Assessment establishes

- where our learners are in there learning
- where they need to go in their learning
- what needs to be done for them to get there

Faculties have planned effective assessment opportunities, in line with the school assessment policy, within their schemes of learning to support our learners to make progress. These have been developed to build on our learner's prior experiences. All learners will also undertake the Welsh Government personalised tests within each academic year from years 7 to 9. The English and Mathematics faculties will decide when learners will undertake these tests.

## Reporting

We will report on learner's progress, alongside reporting on their approach to learning at intervals during the academic year.

**Year 7 September 2023:** All learners will receive an Autumn report where we report on their approach to learning and a report in both the spring and summer term which reports on both their progress and their approach to learning. It is important to note that the progress a learner is making will be relative to their learning pathway and is not a measure of attainment as a direct comparison with other students at a single point in time.

**Year 8 September 2023:** All learners will receive a termly report which reports on both on their progress relative to their learning pathway and their approach to learning.
